

Organizational overview

HCA HealthONE Swedish - a part of HCA HealthONE, a Level 1 trauma center and 504 bed hospital, is proud to be part of the South Denver metro community for more than 115 years. A proud member of the community since 1905 when a group of Swedish immigrants led by Dr. Charles Bundsen founded the hospital as a tuberculosis sanatorium. A half a century later, Swedish became the first general hospital in Arapahoe County.

The care team, nationally recognized for healthcare quality, safety and exceptional outcomes, treats more than 200,000 patients per year through the main campus in Englewood and free-standing emergency departments in Littleton and Lakewood. HCA HealthONE Swedish is renowned for its specialists' expertise in burn and reconstructive care, stroke and neurological care, cardiovascular care, oncology, orthopedics, minimally invasive surgery, women's care and rehabilitation services.

HCA HealthONE is named by PINC AI as the top health system in Colorado and the number two large health system in the United States.

Building leaders from within




China Opland - China was promoted to manager of ortho/spine in 2024. As a clinical nurse coordinator in oncology, China played a key role in advancing care for our patients—developing a clinical process to optimize chemotherapy administration, training colleagues on surgical airway risks and helping transition blood cancer services to the Northwest Tower.



Nick Agostino – Nick was promoted to vice president of surgical services in 2024. Nick joined the HCA HealthONE team in 2019 as a CNC in the main operating room. Less than a year later, he stepped into the role of director of orthopedics, where he oversaw pre- and post-op care, the orthopedic OR, GI lab and anesthesia techs. In 2021, he became administrative director, expanding his oversight to include all three operating rooms, the GI lab and anesthesia techs. Nick has helped lead several key improvements to our surgical services, including the opening of our new centralized sterile processing department.



Elisha Nunley - Elisha became our new assistant chief nursing officer in 2024. A dedicated nurse for 19 years—12 of those here at HCA HealthONE Swedish—Elisha brings a wealth of experience and leadership to the role. Over the past year and a half, she has served as our vice president of emergency services, leading teams at the main campus, Swedish Southwest ER and Swedish Belmar ER. During her time in that role, she implemented a new operations plan for the ER called Navigated Care to improve safety, patient experience and efficiency.



Leadership development professional development programs

HCA HealthONE's Trailhead, Ridgeline and Vista colleague development programs provide a multidisciplinary environment for advancing a comprehensive set of practical leadership skills. Participants gain an understanding of their personal and professional identity and how that shapes leadership and followership. Trailhead targets leadership fundamentals over 18 hours of classroom time, Ridgeline develops intermediate and supervisory skills over 24 hours and Vista, a one-year program builds advanced leadership skills over 14 days and 12 different learning methodologies. - Vanita Bellen, Director of Organizational Development
